Trail Etiquette

Trail Etiquette

In order to properly enjoy and preserve Open Space, please observe the following:

1. Stay on designated trail.
NO SHORTCUTTING!
2. Keep your dog **on a leash.**
3. Please **pick up** after your dog.
4. **Do not trespass!**
5. The **only public access to Cerro San Luis** is off of **Fernandez Rd.,** which is located off of the **south bound Marsh St. on-ramp** to HWY 101.
6. **Do not** harrass the wildlife/livestock.

Public Open Space Access Points

The City of San Luis Obispo manages six Open Space areas in and around the City.

The public is encouraged to use the following areas for recreational use:

- *Cerro San Luis Natural Reserve* off of Fernandez Rd., off of the southbound Marsh St. on-ramp to HWY 101
- *Bishop Peak Natural Reserve* on Patricia Dr. just past Patricia Ct.
- *Reservoir Canyon Open Space* at the end of Reservoir Canyon Rd. off of HWY 101
- *Islay Hill Open Space* at the end of Sweetbay Lane
- *South Hills Open Space* at Exposition Dr. & Corrida Dr.
- *Laguna Lake Natural Reserve* located on Madonna Rd. (note: NO PUBLIC ACCESS to Cerro San Luis)
